## DAMAGE TO ROADS LARGE

Pendleton, Jan. 29.—Damage to railroad property in the northwest during the storm and floods of the past fortnight will put at least a \$100,000 crimp in the net profits of the Harriman system for 1909.

This does not include any loss of business, simply the destruction of physical property, such as track, roadbed, bridges, trestles, etc., by wash-outs, slides and high water. Detailed statements of the damage done on various lines and branches of the Harriman system in this territory have not been completed.

General Manager J. P. O'Brien says that he thinks it will reach the above figure. In order to determine the exact loss, as nearly as possible, Mr. O'Brien has sent experts out to make careful inspection and estimates, covering all lines under his jurisdiction, and until they make their reports, the extent of the storm's havoc will not be known.
