SCRIBER'S ACTIONS PROBED BY GRAND JURY FEB. 15

The federal grand jury for the spring term of the United States district court will begin its grind February 15, says the Portland Journal. Forty-one names of veniremen from which a grand jury is to be selected, were drawn before Judge Wolverton this morning. The veniremen will be ordered to report for duty at 2 o'clock on the afternoon of February 15.

Among the cases to be considered is that of the government against William Hanley, the cattle king of the Pacific coast, and various others, charged with having illegally fenced thousands of acres of land belonging to the United States. In addition to Hanley there are five other defendants in the same case.

Another case of interest is that against J. W. Scriber, the La Grande banker, against whom two counts of forgery have been filed. Scriber was arrested by the federal authorities for juggling the accounts of the Farmers & Traders National bank of which he was cashier.
