ASSESSOR T. A. RINEBART

is Called to Salem by the Governor-Leaves Tonight.

Assessor T. A. Rinchart leaves to night for Salem, being called by the newly created board to adjust the stattax muddle which was caused by a reent supreme court decision, and which the legislature has attempted to straighten out. The board consist of the governor, Secretary of state and state treasurer, and they have called several assessors from different portions of the state to assist them Ir their deliberations. Assessor Rinehart has for years favored taxing property at its true value, and he still believes that it is the proper way. However, when going before this board he does not propose to insist upon this policy to the detriment of Union county. It would not be right for Union county to pay her percentage of state tax based on full valuation in comparison with those counties who only assess at one-fourth or one-third or one half valuations.
