NEW TEAMS WANT "IN"

HEPPNER, HOOD RIVER AND THE DALLES TO JOIN. Eastern Oregon Athletic Conference Will Be Made Larger by Three Teams and the Territory Greatly Increased—Suggested to Sub-Divide Football, But Unit in Track Work—Conference Meeting Place Still Undecided.

Hood River, Heppner and The Dalles high school are anxious to accept invitations to join the Eastern Oregon Athletic conference, to be formed this month, and thereby is created a new phase of the conference perfection problem. These two extreme west-end towns are to be represented in the conference, then it is obviously just to give Pendleton the conference, as that place would be nearer the center of the territory represented at the meeting. Just what will be done with the new towns, is not definitely decided, but it is evident that La Grande will have new faces to contend with when the annual eastern Oregon meet is held at Pendleton this spring.

In track meets the new arrangement will be very satisfactory, as more teams will be entered, giving added interest to the event. But in football and baseball circles, there is likely to be some dissatisfaction. However, if the conference decides to take in the two towns, the best arrangement possible will be made for all branches of high school sports. The cost of bringing football and baseball teams from The Dalles and Hood River to Baker for instance, will necessarily be great. It has been suggested that football be sub-divided into two sections; Hood River, The Dalles and other west-end towns being grouped in one section, and the other The champions of each division could play a post-season game, settling for good and all the championship of the entire eastern Oregon. This would alleviate the expense of playing all the teams through the

championship routine. In any event track and field athletics will welcome the advent of new material.

Principal Hampton, of Pendleton, passed through La Grande last evening and while negotiations were to take place for the settlement of the conference meeting place, nothing was done on account of the new color given the territory to be represented.

If the plans now advanced are carried out along lines equitable to all, the eastern Oregon high school conference will be a powerful organization, bound to augur good for all participating members.
