WAR IN CHINATOWN

San Francisco, Feb. 9.—The dragon of war is showing its teeth in Chinatown today and there is a feeling of uneasiness among San Francisco celebrities, owing to the fact that the peace pact entered into by the warring Suey Don and On Yick tongs will expire tomorrow. As a result of the feud, two On Yick members and one Suey Don man have already been killed. In order that the Chinese New Year might be celebrated in peace and amity, the rival tongs agreed to suspend further murderous activities until February 19. The temporary treaty of peace will become effective tomorrow, and further outbreaks of the murderous hatred that exists in the ranks of the two tongs are confidently anticipated.

The Suey Dons allege that the On Yicks are cravens and cowards and are not playing the game according to the rule, because of the fact that the latter tong has appealed to the courts of the white devils to bring about the punishment of the Suey Dons responsible for the murder of the two On Yick men, Lew Hong and Wong Lung. The On Yicks have promised to assist the prosecuting attorney in bringing the assailants to justice, and have employed a prominent local attorney to assist the prosecution. This action has aroused the Suey Dons to impotent wrath, not unmixed with fear, and a permanent peace pact may yet be agreed upon which will put an end to the warfare of the tongs and stop the prosecution of the alleged murderers. Meanwhile, the Suey Dons are calling down upon the heads of the On Yicks all the maledictions in the Chinese vocabulary of cuss words, declaring that their action in appealing to the California courts will put an end to the ancient and honorable profession of assassination, so long the pastime of the rival tongs.
