### CONSIDERATE ROBBER.

A well distributed robbery was reported from Pilot Rock yesterday. The thief seemed to be too kind-hearted to impose upon any one man too heavily, so took a few things from several of his neighbors and started off yesterday morning toward Heppner, via the Pendleton Tribune.

While on the farm of Mr. Pedro de Souza, the thief found a buggy, but upon finding it over carefully described that Mr. Pedro could not afford to let him have the buggy and a horse too, so he called at the back barn door of Neighbor J. H. McLaughlin, and put out a driving horse.

Here the generous soul was confronted by another vexing problem. How could he hitch the horse to the buggy without a harness? And how could Mr. McLaughlin get along if he should lose both his horse and a harness?

Why the solution was simple when he once thought of it. He had not as yet called upon Mr. Bill Hale for his offering. So he rides the horse

to Mr. Hale's place and finds the desired harness.

After buckling the harness upon the horse and hitching the horse to the buggy the clever fellow drove off, but was observed by some one as he was passing through the Butte Creek district, and reported to the sheriff. Sheriff E. M. Shutt of Heppner and the thief was soon shut up in the Morrow county jail.

Marshal McReynolds of Pilot Rock has gone to Heppner after the man and his collection rig, and will bring him to Pendleton to give an account of his actions and to have his outfit invoiced and redistributed. The name of the thief is not known for certain, but it is thought to be Lyde.
