TAKE ACTION ABOUT ROADS

While the Johnson road bill is attracting much attention from farmers in Oregon and in view of the fact that it has passed one branch of the legislature and is liable to become a law, deep interest is manifested among the farmers and farmers of Union county. Believing that bonds mean bondage, the Blue Mountain Grange, No. 145, of this county, has adopted the following preamble and resolutions, of timely interest:

Whereas, it has been asserted that we, Patrons of Husbandry, are opposed to road improvements, because we (are) object to mortgaging the future to obtain better roads; and

Whereas, we are in favor of the best roads that can be had within our ability to pay for and not be compelled to transfer our titles of realty to the bondholders; and

Whereas, bonds mean bondage to the signers thereof, and the extension of the credit system, which is decidedly more profitable to the creditor than to the debtor in most instances, and contrary to our declaration of principles to discountenance the mortgage systems, and

Whereas, it is our opinion that we can and should pay for all the improved roads we are able to build each year, if honestly and intelligently done; therefore be it

Resolved, That we are opposed to bonding for any purpose or increasing taxes faster than the wealth and population of the county increases, believing that an honest and economical business management of such county will supply all the funds needed for every necessary public improvement without shifting any part of the responsibility upon a district, thereby creating inequality of burden and benefit.
