## SEEK TATE'S FULL PARDON

Policeman J. H. McLachlen is doing a meritorious act in circulating a petition to be presented to Governor Chamberlain, to pardon Mangel Tate, for the larceny of a watch, the property of Maggie Mahaffey, and sentenced to seven years in the penitentiary. During the trial there were peculiar circumstances that led the jury to bring in the verdict of guilty. However, all the testimony directly connected with the theft of the watch were circumstantial and the court, in passing sentence, was imbued with the idea that if Tate did not take the property, he knew where it was, and in passing sentence Judge Crawford gave him seven years, with the proviso that if the prisoner would tell where the property was, the court would parole him. But Tate proclaimed his innocence first, last and all the time, and was taken to Salem.

It is understood that several minor things have come to light since the trial which point towards the innocence of the prisoner, and Judge Crawford and District Attorney Ivanhoe will both sign the petition asking for his pardon. Mr. McLachlen states that he has not presented the petition to anyone who was conversant with the facts, who was not glad of an opportunity to aid in securing Tate's release.

## MODEL FARM AT HERMISTON

Hermiston, Ore., Feb. 15.—That the experimental farm for the Umatilla reclamation project is to be ready for business at the earliest possible moment is evidenced by the action being taken by the local government officials. Though the bill providing for Oregon's one-half of the maintenance expense yet lacks the signature of the governor to make it a law, lumber is now being rushed to the site of the proposed farm for the erection of the necessary buildings and construction work will be started as soon as the appropriation becomes an assured fact.

This action of the government officials is highly gratifying to the settlers on the project, both actual and prospective, as all are anxious to be shown what crops are best adapted, how to use the water to the best advantage and be enlightened on the many other points which make for successful farming in a new irrigated section.

The new experimental farm is to be located on the NW 1/4 of NW 1/4 of section 3, township 4 north, range 28, and is just one mile north of Hermiston. The buildings to be erected are, a home for the superintendent, a barn, an office and a laboratory.

11,000 Acres Under Water.

Of the 22,000 acres contained in the project, 11,000 are now supplied with water and Mr. Newell hopes to have another opening this fall. The remainder of the land will be thrown open in two or three different lots.

An interesting point in this connection is the announcement from Mr. Newell that hereafter a more general notice will be given in the opening than in the past. In both former instances if a couple were permitted to slip in and see on the land before the general public knew it was to be thrown open.

Mr. Newell has also received official authorization of the extending of the "winter mail" to be made. There is therefore no longer any doubt as to the correctness of the report which was sent out from Washington through the press dispatches two weeks ago.

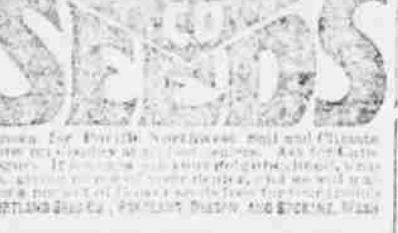
