SPURIOUS COIN MEN ARE ACTIVE

"Watch out for counterfeit money" is the warning that is being sent to every town and city in the northwest. Business men, especially lodging house keepers, are advised to carefully inspect all \$5 and \$10 gold pieces that are offered them. The counterfeiters have operated in several cities and towns and are now on their way to eastern Oregon.

They operated in The Dalles Saturday and the day before, and a letter describing them and their habits had been sent to the sheriff's office Saturday night. The force is on the lookout for them. They were thought to have bought a ticket from The Dalles as far as Umatilla, but it is uncertain where they will stop.

The band is a most skillful one and for some time past have issued coins of the mintage of 1901. Their spurious gold pieces have been passed in a number of cities and they have succeeded in scattering thousands of dollars of the bogus \$5 and \$10 gold pieces over the country in spite of the efforts of the officers.

The coins are so cleverly made that only an expert can detect them. Those that have been passed through a number of hands are more easily detected, because the counterfeiters have not plated the coins any too well. There are a few slight blemishes in the mold in which the coins were made, but even these defects can hardly be told without the aid of a strong magnifying glass. Another way to distinguish the counterfeit from the real money is by its weight.

It was not until several days ago that the coins began to appear, but just how long the gang who circulated them has been at its work, no one is able to determine. Most of the reports so far received come from owners of small lodging houses and saloons where the counterfeit coins have been passed either in payment for lodging or for drinks over the bar. In some instances the bad pieces of money have found their way into the general trade, having been passed innocently by those receiving them first.

Yesterday saw the transfer in ownership of two residence properties in this city. By the change in ownership, however, La Grande is to lose two families, as Rev. O. H. King and C. T. Colt contemplate removing from the city in the near future.
