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### FIRE'S AFTERMATH

hospitals today. Six hundred escaped from the burning theater.

Disorder reigns. Firemen and the police are unable to control the situation. The suffering is intense. The supplies of medicine are exhausted. There are no means of preparing the dead for burial.

Nothing remains but a pile of ashes where the theater stood. Many of the victims are unidentified. Whole families were burned to death in many instances.

### Women Raved With Grief.

Nearly every living resident lost some friend or relative in the fire. The terrible grief of the relatives is probably the most distressing feature of the disaster. Many women lost their senses.

The bodies are handled in the best way possible. The remains that were burned to a crisp were buried in trenches. Communication is gradually being restored. The only wires are being used by the government. Medical supplies, nurses, and physicians are being rushed to the scene.

### Suicides Hard to Prevent.

A dispatch says a young woman whose husband and small son were burned to death, threw herself into the fire, and when rescued it was learned she had swallowed poison.

There is little hope of preventing suicides in the midst of such confusion and sorrow. The whole population seems to be tottering on the verge of insanity. Men, women and children are either running wildly around the ruins calling to dead ones, or staggering along the streets under their weight of grief. Sorrow has entered every house. Everybody is walking the streets, either weeping bitterly, or too stunned by the terrible disaster to utter a sound. In the meantime scores of men are engaged in digging among the smoldering ruins for bodies, watched by a vast crowd, held back by the police. Occasionally a shriek of some woman in the crowd rents the air. This is invariably followed by a chorus of moans by hundreds.

### LIVELY BASEBALL WAR.

#### Shortstop Tinker Tells His Story of Bonus Offered by Murphy.

Chicago, Feb. 16.—The merriest baseball war the big league magnates and to deal with in many years is expected to come either tonight or tomorrow when the national commission meets, and takes up the rumored scandal connected with the alleged offer of \$10,000 bonus to the Chicago Cubs by President Murphy of the club, if they won the pennant. Such an offer is against strict rules. The Cubs won the world's championship, but the bonus was not forthcoming. Joe Tinker, the great shortstop, told the story that started the trouble.

#### Coal Trust Defense.

New York, Feb. 16.—Hearings in the government suit against anthracite coal roads composing the alleged "coal trust" will be resumed today, when the defendants will present their side of the case and attempt to offset the evidence and allegations of the government. Among the documentary evidence offered by the government's attorneys was a table of statistics showing that of the 76,000,000 tons of coal produced only 16,000,000, or about 21 per cent, was produced by independent operators. Of this 16,000,000 tons it was alleged that all except 6,697,511 tons is in the control of the railroads by contract or otherwise at the time it leaves the mines.

#### Mississippi Masons.

Meridian, Miss., Feb. 16.—Mississippi members of Masonic fraternities are pouring into Meridian today to participate in the annual grand lodge meetings, which will be in progress here during the next four days. Several hundred delegates are in attendance and many public entertainments will be given in their honor.
