## BOY SAVES BOY'S LIFE

In bravely plunging into the icy waters of the mill race in the east end of the city to save the 4-year-old baby son of Mr. Gutott, the blind musician of Johnson's orchestra, Charles Bond, the 16-year-old son of Mrs. George Ernest, of West Railroad street, barely escaped drowning yesterday afternoon.

As the young man and his mother were riding up Court street they were attracted by the frantic screams of a woman, and upon jumping out of the rig, he saw the little boy floating down the stream. The young man ran down the side of the stream, until he was about even with the child, and then leaped from the high bank. When he struck the water he sank and being greatly encumbered with shoes and clothes, he was unable to reach the child until it had floated away from him.

The terrified cries of the mother and the excited admonitions of spectators bothered the young man and that, combined with the intense cold of the water, caused him to struggle. The two then floated down some little ways from Court street to Union street, before being rescued.

By the time the child and the young man had reached Union street, Officer William Sheer had arrived on the scene, and with ready presence of mind had a rope handy to throw to the plucky young man, who, in an unconscious state, grasped the rope which he felt about his body.

As soon as he could turn to the child Mr. Sheer rescued it also, and he two were taken safely into Mr. Sheer's residence.

The condition of the young man who made such a heroic effort to save the child was far more serious. For some time it was gravely feared he could not be brought to life. As soon as the water was forced from his lungs he was revived.
