**ANXIOUS TO CHANGE LAW**

Yesterday afternoon three committees of business men were started out in the interests of legislation on the local option law. The committees in Pendleton are for the purpose of interesting legislation tending to make local option in cities to be governed by the vote of the cities and irrespective of the rural districts. This would make it possible for the rural districts to be dry and the cities in the same counties to remain either wet or dry, according to the vote of a majority of the voters in the respective cities. It is figured under this arrangement that some of the cities in dry counties might be changed to wet territory, and some of the cities in wet counties may go dry, according to the wishes of the voters.

The three committees which started out with the petitions in Pendleton at noon yesterday finished their labors at 4 o'clock for the first afternoon's work with a little over 250 signatures to the lists. The committees will start early in the morning and try to complete a canvass of the city before tonight. The committees expect to have not less than 500 names to these petitions. The committees only had seven refusals to sign during the afternoon's work.

The proposition is not a new one in the state, but efforts of the committee to have the new law passed and they argue that not until a law is passed coinciding with the wishes of the petitioners, will the state enjoy local option in its fullest sense. The temperance element will form a strong lobby against any change in the present law, and it is presumed that if the petition results in the presentation of a bill that there will be a line-up for battle on the floors of the legislature.

Judging from the signatures secured to the petition here yesterday the business men of the city are almost a unit in favor of the enactment of a new law on local option in Oregon, that will give the cities and towns a right to express their own opinion on the local option law without being required to be governed by any votes to be submitted by the rural districts. Just what effect the circulation of these petitions will have on the Umatilla county delegates in the legislature is merely conjecture.

**CIVIC PRIDE STIRS TOWN**

A special from Weston to the Pendleton Tribune of yesterday says: At a mass meeting in Weston tonight, assurance was given to the councilmen that the citizens are back of them in their desires to improve the city.

There has never been a stronger sentiment for local improvement than that existing here at the present time. Among the plans under discussion are those for covering the streets with a coating of crushed rock, that they may be made firm for hauls and more attractive to strangers passing through. Another plan is to plant shade trees along the roads leading into the city and to park parking. The improvement of the streets themselves by adding a good coating of crushed rock, however, is the first of the plans which will be carried out.

Frank Bryant, for 12 months city marshal and water superintendent and who was re-elected by the council for the ensuing year, has tendered his resignation to take effect immediately.
