STRIKE GAS AT ONTARIO

Baker City, Feb. 17.—The Democrat said this morning:

Local stockholders of the Ontario Co-operative Gas & Oil company were rejoiced yesterday by the news that gas had been struck in the well of that company's property and that the flow was sufficient to justify the most optimistic expectations of that company.

Immediately following the strike Grant Carroll of Carroll & Simpson local brokers, who were handling the stock, received a telegram to withdraw all further stock from the general market and stating that the present shareholders alone would profit by the strike.

Gas was struck in the well in a small quantity a few days ago, but the flow got better as the drillers went further down and at a depth of 2200 feet the flow was considered sufficient to withdraw any further stock from the market.

The Ontario Gas & Oil company is composed of local Ontario people, who have already put about \$20,000 into the development of their property and the well is at present down to a depth considerably below sea level.

San Francisco, Feb. 17.—Former Supervisor M. W. Coffey was today found guilty of accepting a bribe of \$4000 from the United Railroads, for a vote favoring the overhead trolley.

MILLIONS IN FAIR VALLEY

(Continued from page 1.)
The meeting of the stockholders is to be held on Tuesday, March 2, at the offices of John L. Rand in this city. Its purpose is to cancel the present \$350,000 mortgage upon the property and to bond the road instead in the sum of \$2,000,000, which will be used in the development of the vast schemes which are said to be outlined by the promoters of the railroad proposition.

Is Money in Sight?
That the Eagle Valley railroad company has the necessary \$2,000,000 in sight is indicated by the language of the call, which is to authorize the cancellation of the present mortgage, from which it is concluded that the new plan has been financed and that the men behind the scheme have at least the money necessary to retire the original bond issue.

Irrigate Big Tract.
Although definite information as to the plans of the company could not be secured last evening, it was stated upon good authority that the company will use a large portion of the money to be secured through the bond issue for the development of a big irrigation project along the line of the road and tributary to this city. Surveys for the scheme have been made and it is declared feasible by some of the best authorities on irrigation in the state. The company plans a reservoir proposition, through which it will be able to store enough water to allow of a full year's irrigation for several thousand acres of now dry lands.

Vast Timber Resources.
In addition to the big irrigation scheme planned, it is also understood that the management proposes to extend the line down Powder river to Snake river, affording an outlet on the northwestern line at Robbinette. This will give an opportunity for other extensions, as a logging road into the fine timber country lying back from the road up Goose Creek and further back.

Berlin, Feb. 17.—Roosevelt will spend several weeks here as a guest of the kaiser according to an announcement made today.
