**"Uncle Joe" Anniversary.**  
Washington, Feb. 18.—Today is an important anniversary for Speaker Joseph G. Cannon, for on this day his friends are congratulating him upon the completion of his 35th year as an orator in congress.

It was on February 18, 1874, that Representative Cannon, not then showing any signs of becoming "Uncle Joe," and a candidate for the presidency, made his maiden speech in the house.

Nearly all who heard him, make his address on that day, are dead. Among them were James R. Garfield, James G. Blaine, Samuel J. Randall, Joseph R. Hawley, Henry L. Dawes, George F. Hoar, Benjamin F. Butler, Alex. H. Stephens, Lucius Q. C. Lamar and Fernando Wood.

The speech, which was young Cannon's maiden effort, was on a bill reducing rates of postage on books and for the free carriage of country newspapers in rural districts. It was a success in spite of interruptions.

**Conservation Congress.**  
Washington, Feb. 18.—The North American Conservation congress, called by President Roosevelt, was opened this morning. Official delegates are present from Canada and Mexico. From present indications the session will continue about three days. A social program is being made up which will permit the American government to honor its guests and the two embassies to entertain their counterparts.

Although the conference will continue the resources of the whole continent, the number in attendance is not a very large one. Canada and Mexico each sent three delegates and the only others present are the members of the National Conservation Commission and representatives of the state department and of one or two other executive departments which deal with natural resources. Premier Laurier has written a letter to the president emphasizing his earnest interest.
