CONDUCTORS IN STRIKING MOOD

DISCHARGE OF COMMITTEE—MAN AT BOTTOM OF IT.

Southern Pacific Conductors and Other Trainmen Ballot on Proposition of Going on Strike in Sympathy With a Lone Conductor, Discharged for Insubordination.

Galveston, Texas, Feb. 18.—Conductors on the New Orleans to San Francisco branch of the Southern Pacific balloted until early this morning without deciding whether their union is to strike because the company discharged a fellow employee.

The trouble arose when a conductor of the El Paso division, who served as a member of the grievance committee of the trainmen, was discharged for insubordination after a conference with the Southern Pacific officials.

A DEFINITION OF OSTEOPATHY.

disturbances in the bony framework of the body in causing disease. He studied the skeleton as the foundation of anatomy, upon which science he grounded his system.
