WE MUST SHOVEL SNOW

NEW ORDINANCE PROVIDES KEEPING WALKS CLEAR.

Engineer Pickler Chosen as Consulting Engineer—One Man and Only One Can Go on Near Beer License Bonds—Judges and Clerks of Election Chosen—Park Commission to Be Voted for—Permission for Use of Streets Granted.

It is not probable that the ordinance will become effective in time to be of much advantage this year, but hereafter property owners must keep the snow off their walks, according to action of the council in regular session last night.

Engineer Pickler was awarded the position of consulting engineer in the construction of the Beaver creek project on a basis of three per cent of the contract price of \$148,000, contingent upon the American Light & Water company making good their contract.

In response to the demands of the committee of business men, the council granted the use of the streets for a street carnival.

The matter of the selection of a park commission will be submitted to the voters at the coming election.

The ordinance providing for fire protection, entrance of public buildings, etc., was looked upon as being rather strenuous for a city of our class and was referred to a title printing.

A petition was presented asking for a sidewalk to be constructed on the north side of Pennsylvania avenue, between Third and Fourth. Referred to street committee, as also was the petition to have Spring avenue opened to Fourth street.

There were six or seven petitions for licenses to sell near beer, but owing to a ruling made by the council some time ago to permit no one person to go on the bonds of more than one applicant, and as each and every application before the council contained as one of the sureties the name of one man and all of the applications were returned for correction.

Killed While Rescuing China Woman. San Francisco, Feb. 18.—During a daring rescue of a number of Chinese women hemmed in by a fire in a lodging house today, Lieutenant Jeremiah Collins and Fireman J. W. Perry, and William Jeffers were seriously injured, being thrown from a ladder by the explosion of gas in the burning building. Three buildings were partially ruined. The loss is about \$25,000.
