The inward and outward movement of aliens for the 12 months ending with November, 1908, the figures of which were made public today by the department of commerce and labor, indicate that the emigration has been greater than the immigration. The figures are: Total arrivals, 573,581; total departures, 644,452. To this number of emigrants should be added the unknown number of naturalized citizens who during that period have left the United States for permanent residence abroad. During January, 1909, as compared with January, 1908, the immigration from Austria increased 4428; from Hungary, 7916; from Italy, 4997. From Russia and Finland there was a decrease of 852 and from Japan a decrease of 768. The immigration of Chinese increased 84 the month of January.

The Normal school question is certainly in a muddle. The house passed a bill giving to Weston, Monmouth and Ashland each \$100,000, while the senate passed one Normal bill authorizing the sale of all other Normal property and providing \$100,000 fund for building and equipment. How the matter will end is problematic. The one Normal idea is immensely popular throughout the state, and is really the only common sense solution of the whole Normal question.—Eugene Register.

If congress passes the bill which yesterday passed the lower house, to prohibit the shipping of liquor into dry territory, it will make it much easier to enforce the local option laws, and there will not be five or six barrels of whisky consigned to fertile people in the depot, as is the case today; unless the goods were delivered after shipping hours yesterday evening.

In Chicago about 1300 printers are kept busy during the summer months working on catalogs for the mail order houses. Merchants in the small towns can only combat the mail order business by pitiful advertising in the home papers.

We venture that not a few of our readers were mighty glad that new ordinance requiring all property owners to clean the snow off of their sidewalks was not in effect.

A few more campaigns like the last one and Speaker Cannon will be an open and avowed prohibitionist. He sees things quite different than he did at the last session.

There will be a county seat on the lower Umatilla one of these days. It is up to the people, and especially the property owners of Echo, to say where.—Echo Register.

STOLE HAT SAYS CHARGE
