will eventually result in a mitigation of the sentence imposed upon the night riders, and that they will escape the gallows.

The so-called night riders were alleged to have inaugurated a veritable reign of terror and many atrocious crimes are attributed to them, although they were convicted specifically of the assassination of Captain Quentin Rankin at Walnut Log, on October 19 last.

Appeal to the supreme court was taken at the conclusion of the trial last month, after the court had overruled a motion for a new trial, based on various grounds. They were in substance that the court had erred in excluding certain testimony and in receiving the evidence of various witnesses in refusing each defendant 24 challenges; in allowing proof as to night rider meetings and acts of lawlessness unconnected with the murder of Captain Rankin; and that one of the jurors had before the trial expressed an opinion as to what should be done with the man who killed Captain Rankin.

Both houses worked late into the night. The bill for sterilization of the criminally insane, incurable insane has not reached the governor. All indications point to him signing it.

The Normal school fight still involves both houses. Sentiment is growing favorable to supporting three schools as at present, located at Weston, Ashland and Monmouth. An effort is being made to amend the Smith bill for one school, to be located at Portland, and leave the board of regents to locate one school, and abolish two. This is considered in the interest of Monmouth. It is charged that the Ashland and Weston schools will be traded off for the Crater Lake road bill and the eastern Oregon asylum bill. The Crater Lake road bill carries \$100,000, and hung up the session.

Ordinance No. 407, Series 1909.

An ordinance providing for the removal of snow and ice from sidewalks. The City of La Grande Does Ordain as Follows: Section 1. The tenant or occupant or any person having the care of a building or of land bordering on a street where there is a sidewalk, within the city of La Grande, or if there is no tenant, occupant or other person having the care of the whole of such building or of any such land, the owner of agent thereof shall, within the first six hours of daylight after

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the snow ceases to fall, cause the same to be removed therefrom; the entire length of said premises, and for a space not less than three feet in width. The provisions of this section shall also apply to the falling of snow from buildings.

Sec. 2. Whenever any portion of any sidewalk within the city is encumbered with ice, the tenant or occupant of a building or of land adjoining a street whereon is such sidewalk, or in case there is no occupant of a whole of such building or of any such land, the owner or agent or other person having the care of the same, shall cause such sidewalk to be made safe and convenient by removing the ice therefrom, or by covering the same with some ashes or some other suitable substance, within the first six

hours of daylight, after the formation of said ice. Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof before the recorder, be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00, nor more than \$10.00. Sec. 4. This ordinance shall be published in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer, and after its approval by the mayor, be in force and take effect on and after the 20th day of March, 1909.

Passed the common council on the 17th day of February, 1909, by five members voting therefor. Approved this 18th day of February, 1909. M. K. HALL, Mayor. Attest: D. E. COX, Recorder.
