### BOOKS AND MAGAZINES.

A volume of poems has just been published by Strickland W. Gillilan, of New York. The book is entitled "Including Finnigin," and is made up of poems both grave and gay, but nearly all are philosophical, as the author says in his preface. No better review of the book could be written than one of the poems, which we give below. By the way, Mr. Gillilan is a brother of Rev. J. D. Gillilan, D. D., of La Grande:

#### A Modest Prayer.

And hate to give it up until I've tried a little more?  
And then, besides, you'd never want an angel half so dense—

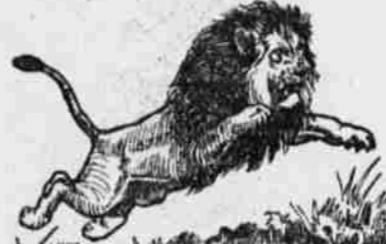
