GET RICH QUICK BUYING
WALLOWA COUNTY LANDS

Joseph, Ore., March 2.—(Special.)—A large dairying and farming deal was consummated here Saturday, when Thomas Morgan sold to Hugh Wilson the only large dairying outfit in the county, which includes 109 cows and a milking machine, and in which deal land within one mile of Joseph was transferred at a price in excess of \$100 per acre. Several days ago, Morgan sold his quarter section of land in which he carried on his dairying, for \$8000, at a profit of about \$2500 in three years. The sale of Wilson shows a still larger profit in proportion than the other, which is probably explained by the fact that the one is within less than a mile of Joseph, and the other

this morning from Texas, where Mr. Carbine has been for the past five months disposing of 75 carloads of Grande Ronde valley apples. He states his trip was financially satisfactory. However, the highest price he received for any of his stock was \$1.50 per box on board the cars at La Grande. Of these 75 cars handled, 42 were disposed of in the Texas market, after he reached there. He says that Grande Ronde apples were equal to anything shipped into that section of the country and the competitors were the choice packers from all the fruit-growing sections of the northwest.

WOLVERTON'S DECISION IN CELEBRATED KIVETTE CASE.

Wherein Both State and Federal Courts Have Been Called to Settle Issues Brought Out in the Bankruptcy Proceedings of W. R. Kivette, Whose Operations in and About North Powder Were Extensive.

In the matter of W. R. Kivette, bankrupt, wherein the Bank of Commerce of Boise, asked to be adjudged a preferred creditor to the extent of \$24,000, based on the possession of a mortgage given originally for \$42,000, which was credited with a \$20,000 payment, the following is the order of Judge Wolverton to whom the case was appealed from Referee John Hodgkin of this city.

"This cause has been considered by the court upon the record of the referee, certified here for decision, concerning the claim of the Bank of Commerce to be paid in full before all other creditors, claiming such right by virtue of a mortgage given by the bankrupt upon his property prior to the adjudication herein, which claim of preference was by the referee, after hearing, on July 2, 1908, disallowed and denied by an order entered in said cause; which order has been reviewed by this court and now, at this time, having come to the conclusion that the order made by the referee, disallowing said claim to preference, is just, proper, and in accordance with the law. It is now, here, ordered and adjudged that the said order entered herein by the said referee be, and the same is hereby, in all particulars affirmed.
