TWO SIDES TO HAZING

La Grande entertains conflicting opinions as to the hazing episode at Eugene, and especially as a La Grande boy is one of the accused, "the other side" of the story is republished from an interview granted the Oregonian by two of the accused, Chester Downs of Portland and James Neill of La Grande. Private advices from Eugene corroborate the story told in the following interviews, the first with Mr. Downs:

"Bristol was not in my class and none of us knew that he was suffering from any mental trouble. His habit of constantly being late was very trying. Frequently putting us behind in class work. I don't think that the bathtubting could have caused his breakdown, he seemed to take it good naturedly enough, resisting only when we took charge of him at the bottom of the stairs. He was not in the tub more than five or six seconds and came out of it in good spirits."

James Neill, the only other student who could be interviewed tonight, said:

"I was not well acquainted with Bristol, nor did I know at the time of his mental troubles or worries. I don't think any of the fellows knew much about him. He seemed to take his tubbing philosophically, and I do not think the excitement could have affected him so seriously. Eight or 10 of the students in the dormitory had been tubbed before Bristol, and nothing was thought of it."

"The published statements regarding the incident have been greatly exaggerated. There was only a few inches of water in the tub, the boy had his clothes on, he was not held in the tub at all, remaining there only a few seconds, when he got up and laughingly said, 'That wasn't so bad,' and then some of the fellows got dry clothes for him. The story of breaking down the banisters in the fight on the stairs is untrue, as are many other details of the published story."

Delayed Work at Tables.

The students who "tubbed" Bristol are all working their way through college by waiting on tables. The boys state, and the investigation of the faculty shows, that young Bristol was habitually late at meals. This was in violation of the rules of the Dormitory club, and for two months past his tardiness had caused the waiter boys to be late to classes. He had been asked to do better, and once while in the dining hall had, when asked to come to dinner by one of the waiters, took up a paper to read and thrown the work at his table back 15 or 20 minutes.

At noon on the day of the episode Bristol was late and Downs told him that if he was late again he would have to go to the bathtub. He was late that evening and, when supper was finished, the boys told him they were going to keep their word and put him in the tub.

Kept Knife Tied to Bed.

The mental breakdown of Ralph Bristol occurred two days after the bathtub episode. Investigation here showed that the boy was in his usual health and spirits the day after the event, referring to his experience in a joking way and apparently holding no malice toward his fellow-students.

The family with whom he roomed, the Goodnoughs, who live on the corner of Thirteenth and A streets, say that he showed signs of great fear almost daily; that he seemed afraid to go to bed at night, and that he several times told of things which had happened to him that they knew had not happened. Mrs. Goodnough stated that he kept a knife chained to his bed and some rocks lying by his bedside. She said that she had found a 22-caliber rifle in his bed once or twice.

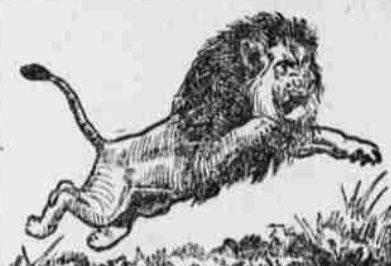
