ASSESSORS IN TALKFEST

One of the best day's work that will be done by the assessor and his deputies this year, was enacted yesterday afternoon in the office of County Assessor T. A. Rinehart. Having called all his deputies together, Mr. Rinehart went over every class of assessable property in the county, and with his deputies arrived at what can be termed an equitable plan of assessment. Each class was discussed separately. This is the first time that such a meeting has been held here, and this time is in strict compliance with the new laws on assessments. It will mean that the new tax law can be complied with next fall when the board of equalization meets, a thing that has not been a fact anywhere in the state in the past, to a greater or less degree due to the conflicts in assessment laws. The last legislature remedied the trouble. Mr. Rinehart was at the assessors' meeting at Salem and much of what he learned there was imparted to his deputies in this county.
