IRRIGATION AT EUGENE

Eugene, March 7.—The county commissioner's court today granted the McKenzie Valley Irrigation & Power company a franchise to cross the county roads with its irrigation ditches which it proposes to construct from a point on the McKenzie river near Hendrick's Ferry to Springfield.

The franchise was granted upon the following conditions: That work on the ditches shall begin within 90 days from date; that 10 miles of the ditches shall be built and be ready for operation within two years from date; that the entire system shall be built and be in operation within four years from date, and that the company shall construct good bridges 16 feet wide across the ditches where they cross the county roads.

The main ditch will have its source in the McKenzie river near Hendrick's Ferry and proceed in a westerly direction. A few miles down it will branch off, one of the branches to empty into the McKenzie river several miles north of Springfield and the other to flow into the Willamette river only a short distance north of that city.

The officers and stockholders of the company are well known and prominent citizens of Springfield and the neighborhood in which the ditches will be operated.

MANY HEAR NEW PASTOR

FORD ELLIS PREACHES INITIAL SERMON SUNDAY.

Fresh From University Halls, New Christian Pastor Opens Work in Local Field—Salvation of Souls Should Be Chief Mission of Any Church.

Ford Ellis, the new minister of the Central Church of Christ, preached to a large and interesting audience Sunday morning. The subject of the sermon was "Soul Winning." He said in part, that the primary mission of the church was not to have a large audience, the most trained choir or the most intellectual preacher, but the salvation of souls. And when the church loses sight of this purpose, it is high unto death. He said that the requisites of a soul-winner are in the reach of all. One must be a consecrated Christian, not one of these wishy-washy that have cold feet in July. He must have the spirit of love, a man of patience, a man of prayer and a constant student of God's word.

Rev. Ellis has just completed a four years' course in Cotner university, Lincoln, Neb. He comes to the La Grande church fresh from the university halls. It is hoped that his stay in this city may be profitable and pleasant for him and the congregation with which he labors.

Duncan Cooper, accused of killing former Senator Carmack. He called Cooper a "high handed gambler," a man who plays for high stakes and never applies his winnings to his honest debts; an embezzler of funds of widows and orphans committed to his care in public office.
