BIG PURCHASE CULMINATING.

Big Deal in Coal Properties Being Perfeeted in Chicago.

Chicago, March 9 .- The purchase of the Walsh coal properties and the properties of the Dering Coal company is culminating rapidly.

The United States Steel corporation, and the Chicago & Eastern Illinois Railroad company are negotiating jointly with the Chicago clearing house ommittee. The transaction, which involves securities and partly agreed values aggregating nearly \$12,000,000. has been under way for some time and is said to give promise of successful culmination.

It is understood the clearing house committee has set a price of \$2,800,-000 on the Walsh coal lands, which property is held by the association among securities in lieu of funds advanced at the time the banks of John

E. Walsh were liquidated. The Option on the Dering Coal company's properties, which is said to have been given the joint purchasing interests some time ago, has been accepted, but the terms have not been made public.

It was learned here that there was held last night a secret cabal of officials and ex-officials whose names have been used or hinted at in the controversy in such a way as to besmirch their dignity, to decide whether the 13th day of February, 1909, and the further publication of all information on the subject will be stopped by censure or whether an argument will be circulated in their defense. The decision reached will be made public by the action taken and it is probable that all articles not favorable to the government side of the case will be quietly suppressed and further disgraceful disclosures prevented.

The rankling article last published ontained a batch of messages sent during the war time which demonstrate that the government, when it found that Blanco was unalterably opposed to surrender, communicated directly with General Torel, the commander at Santiago, giving him a free hand to make terms.

A general meeting was held last night by the members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians to make held March 17, in honor of the patron saint of all Irishmen.
