Postoffice Moved.

The postoffice department has authorized the removal of the postoffice in this city one door west from its present location, into the stone building formerly occupied by the Chieftain newspaper plant. Postmaster Ben Weathers has received notice to that effect, and also that because of the growth of business an increased rental will be allowed for this office. Mr. Weathers hopes to be able to move the office early in April, but the time will depend on how soon he can get the new fixtures for which he is now negotiating.

The new location will be superior to the old, not only being a fire-proof building but in the matter of room, having more than twice the space of the present office. The room now occupied is 15x17 feet in size, giving but 255 square feet in all, while the new room is 14x27 or 518 square feet. The removal was very generally petitioned for by the business men.—Enterprise News-Record.

DELEGATES ELECTED.

Mr. and Mrs. Lantz of Cove, to Represent County at McMinnville.

At a county convention of Patrons of Husbandry held at Imbler, delegates to the State Grange convention at McMinnville were elected. The state convention will be held May 11. The choice of the Imbler convention was Mr. and Mrs. J. K. Lantz of Cove, and Mr. and Mrs. J. W. McAllister of La Grande as alternates.

A resolution was passed requesting the State Grange to use its influence to have a denatured alcohol plant installed at the Agricultural college at Corvallis, and the manufacture of the same taught in the school.

Delegates to the convention from Blue Mountain Grange are J. W. McAllister, C. E. Golden, W. F. Gekeles; C. D. Huffman, deputy.

SHERIFF'S SALE MADE.

is First Step in Reimbursement in the Bank of Commerce Case.

Deputy Sheriff Lindgren is in North Powder today conducting a sheriff's sale in the Bank of Commerce-Kivette case that for months has been in the foreground of local litigation. The entire sale is for \$25,000, but the sale conducted at North Powder today for only personal property amounting to about \$2000. This is the case wherein the decision of Referee in Bankruptcy Hodgkin gave a decision that was later upheld by Judge Wolverton. The fact that this sale was allowed to proceed today is taken to mean that the Bank of Commerce at Boise is not going to appeal further.
