## ELECTRIC LIGHTS ON CARS

### DINING CARS USHER IN NEW O. R. & N. EQUIPMENT

Men Who Handle Electric Lights on Proposed Trains Will Be Schooled for Their Task—Electrically Lighted Dining Car Passed La Grande Yesterday.

An electrically lighted dining car, the forerunner of the electrically-lighted transcontinental trains that after May 2 will traverse the O. R. & N. each way daily, is now being put into service between Green River and Portland. The first of this kind passed La Grande yesterday.

**Electric Train Near.**  
The advance schedule of the two new trains—one each way daily, in addition to the passenger service now in vogue—says Mary 2 is the time of sending out the first trains. The equipment will be electrically lighted, the dynamo being installed in the locomotive.

**Educate Men for Work.**  
It will require seven men to properly attend to the electric dynamos and look after proper connections when coaches or sleepers are either attached to or cut off from the train. The oldest Portland-Huntington express messengers get the plum, and to be fitted to attend to their new tasks, the company will send them to Oakland to be schooled in that branch of electrical science. It requires no great amount of preparation, but the connections between each coach are made similar to the method adopted in connecting the air hose. These connections will invariably be made by the dynamo man.

**Still Another Train Likely.**  
Still another overland duet of trains is discussed and according to rumor will make its appearance in June. The last combination is to more properly handle the predicted traffic to the northwest on account of the fair. It is not to be as finely and elegantly equipped a train as the one to make its appearance in May.

### SMUGGLING AT HONOLULU.

**Will Ask Government to Send Revenue Fleet to Enforce Laws.**  
Honolulu, March 8.—An increasing amount of smuggling of Japanese fishing fleet in and about the Hawaiian islands led today to a decision on the part of the local customs office to appeal to Washington for a rigid investigation. The treasury department will be asked to dispatch a fleet of revenue cutters to the islands to be stationed here until the smuggling traffic is broken.

Deceased was 52 years old and leaves no immediate family. Mr. H. B. Pidcock of this city is the nearest relative.

**King's Wedding Anniversary.**  
London, March 9.—Tomorrow will be the 46th anniversary of the wedding of the king and queen of England, their marriage having taken place March 10, 1863. During the day they were the recipients of many messages of congratulation.

Albert Edward, Prince of Wales, (now King Edward VII), married Alexandra, the oldest daughter of King Christian of Denmark, in St. George's chapel, Windsor, England, 46 years ago. He was then 22 years old and she was 19. Now he is 67 and she is 64.
