DISCUSSES EARTHQUAKES

EARTH TREMBLERS REHEARSED BY CURRENT TOPIC CLUB.

The subject under discussion was earthquakes, and was considered under the leadership of Attorney John Hodgkin. In this paper she was able to recite many interesting features and incidents, which have not been given general publicity through the press. Her paper was illustrated with maps and photographs. In his paper he began with the first records of earthquakes given us in the Bible, and finally finished with the Messina disaster. His paper was replete with facts and gave evidence of careful research and careful compilation.

After the hard-thinking part of the program had been rendered, the company was favored with a piano duet by Misses Ethel Wright and Janet Smith. These little ladies completely captivated the club with the splendid recital and their selection, "The Doves," will long be treasured as a happy memory by all who listened to its skillful rendition.
