PENDLETON MAN DROWNED.

Body of Old Man Found Floating in River—Mystery in Connection.

Pendleton, March 14.—The Sunday Tribune says:

The body of John Gosch, an old resident of Pendleton, was found floating in the Umatilla river west of the county bridge at a point in close proximity to the mouth of Byers' mill race.

Little George Quill, aged 7 years, and Vernie Brown, aged 14, who with some companions were gathering buttercups on the banks of the stream, made the shocking discovery about 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

A telephone message was sent to the coroner, Mr. Folsom, and he journeyed to the scene with assistants and soon lifted the body from the cold waters of the stream and placed it in a "pick-up" box and hurried it to the morgue. The body was immediately identified by a Tribune representative. Just how the old man came to his death may never be known. When the body was found it was hatless, coatless and shoeless. At 6:30 o'clock yesterday morning, City Marshal Thomas Gurdane saw John Gosch on the street downtown, walking east. He crossed Main street and the marshal accosted him, but received no reply. Thinking this strange, Mr. Gurdane addressed the early morning pedestrian again, but Mr. Gosch made no answer.

The officer thought nothing of this occurrence until after learning of the tragic end of the deceased later in the day. At that time in the morning Mr. Gosch was dressed in his usual street attire, and attracted no particular attention on the street.

Declared Insane Friday.

Friday afternoon before County Judge Gilliland, on evidence submitted by Dr. Cole, and on complaint made by Dr. Vincent, John Gosch was declared of unsound mind and papers were sent to Salem asking for his commitment to the insane asylum. In his mental condition he was considered harmless, and after the insanity proceedings he was permitted to go to his home at 519 Jane street, where he had been keeping bachelor quarters for the period of a year.

His last-remembered act Saturday morning, the neighbors state, and he placed a plate on the front porch for the bread man who left him a loaf of bread at 7 o'clock. The house was locked at the time and Gosch had evidently left the premises.

He was last seen working about the place on Friday afternoon late, when

he raked the yard and prepared to burn the leaves and rubbish. He left for a stroll in the evening before burning the rakings. He spent the night in his home and when he left Saturday morning, he locked up the house, placing the receptacle for the bread on the porch and started downtown, after turning his house cat out for the day. He was not seen around the place after that hour.

He has been acting strangely for the past three months and imagined that some one was pursuing him. He may have had one of these strange hallucinations and ended his own life by drowning. The supposition is that he committed suicide. There were no marks of violence on the body.

Mr. Beckley's claim was taken out in regular form and title is not disputed. Mrs. Beckley will join her husband here this evening, and they will proceed to Portland together.
