MR. ROBERTS OUT TONIGHT

RECEIVER DEPARTMENT IS CLOSED AT LAND OFFICE.

Mr. Roberts' Resignation Went Into Effect at 4 O'clock This Afternoon—Office Open to Filing, But No Disbursing or Receiving of Public Money.
