MESSAGE TO COUNCIL

Mayor Hall's message to the council was read last evening and terms with plausible advice, which if followed out by the council will mean rapid improvement of streets and sewer systems. The message in full follows: Mayor's Message.

To the Members of the City Council of La Grande:

I believe it is our duty to review briefly the work accomplished by the council during the past civic year and to identify and bring into prominence our mistakes, if such there have been, in order that we may render better service during the term upon which we are just entering.

I shall take the liberty of making certain recommendations for the consideration of each department committee in the council.

In the department of streets and alleys considerable new board walk has been constructed and some cement walk, by property owners, and some new cross walks by the city; also there has been some work done on street intersections.

Ordinances were passed some time ago providing that cement sidewalks be constructed to replace worn out walks in certain parts of the city, notably on Main avenue, Depot street, and one lot on Second street, which latter is now and has been for some time without a sidewalk, notwithstanding that the property owners on both sides have built new cement walks.

Those ordinances were passed by the council with the expectation that they would be carried out; the work of carrying them out is in the hands of the street committee and it is without doubt the duty of such committee to at once take the necessary steps toward their fulfillment. The duties of the street committee are more onerous than those of any other committee and the chairman and members of the same have given much time and thought to the work during the past year. I wish to suggest a plan, however, which I believe if followed, will enable them to do more efficient work because done systematically. This would apply to all committees in the council.

The Plans Suggested.

An ordinance in effect provides that each committee shall hold a meeting not less than five days preceding regular meetings of the council for the purpose of considering the work of their department and to which it is their duty to give their careful attention, decide what should be done, have ordinances or resolutions drafted and place them before the council for consideration of the whole, with the committee's recommendation.

I believe that compliance with this ordinance should expedite the work of the council, whereas the old method of meeting in council with the expectation of considering ordinances and resolutions that have had their origin in a haphazard manner and which must be referred to a standing or special committee for a report as to their efficiency, etc., and which must take their chance as has happened, of being mislaid or forgotten, has been the cause of the non-accomplishment of much legislation that would have been of benefit to the city. I wish, therefore, to request members of committees to take their work seriously and to come to the council meetings with a full understanding of the requirements of their department, and with recommendations.

I do not think that there is a member of this council, nor do I believe there are many residents in this city who do not believe that it is of vital interest to La Grande to improve her streets. Seventy five per cent of our streets are impassable during the whole of winter for heavy loads.

Deplorable Condition of Streets.
All of our streets are in worse condition during the whole of the year than 99 per cent of the roads throughout Grande Ronde valley outside of this city. Ninety per cent of La Grande's citizens deplore this condition of things and are willing to improve them is given an opportunity. Where is the remedy? It is "up to" the city council to find one.
