BUSY SESSION

At 9:45 last night the old council ceased to be officially, and at 9:47 the new administration began. Prior to the eventful event the old council spent over an hour in clearing the table of all unfinished business that was possible. Several new ordinances were read and referred to the proper committees, two relating to the burning of refuse and rubbish. The other, increasing the salary of the city treasurer from \$15 to \$20 per month, the reason for this was the Beaver creek bonds would increase the cash on hand at times. The increase in salary will be required to pay for surety bond on the ordinances introduced become effective the salary of the city attorney will be increased from \$400 to \$600 per annum.

The hose house in South La Grande was ordered painted and several resolutions for street grades were passed. Seven applications to sell near beer were granted, and Mayor Hall asked the present appointive officers to continue their services until he had time for further consideration, also retaining the present committees, excepting appointing Councilman David Bay, chairman of the water committee in place of Councilman Williamson, and appointing Councilman Sheak on all committees heretofore held by retiring Councilman Williamson.

Pendleton Has New Train.

The first exclusively passenger service over the Pendleton-Pasco branch of the Northern Pacific was inaugurated this morning, when the first train pulled into the Webb street depot, exactly on time. The two coaches contained nearly 100 passengers, which was considered good for the first train.

In connection with the new passenger train over the Northern Pacific it is rumored that the O. R. & N. is at last to comply with the wishes of the Pendleton people and will have a Pullman sleeper set out here for the accommodation of those wishing a night train service to Portland.

Passengers can enter this car at any time in the evening and retire. The car will then be picked up by train No. 5, coming here at 11 o'clock, or later, landing the passengers in Portland about 7 o'clock in the morning.

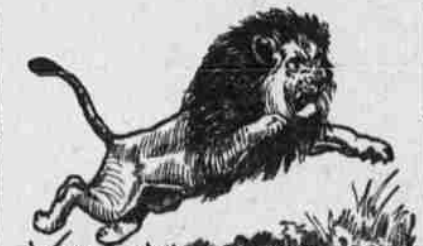
To William Dye, Defendant above named, Greeting:
