FRAUDULENT DEED.

Young Man Held at Baker City on the Charge of Unusual Crime.

Charged with having forged a deed to a one-fifth interest in the famous Rainbow mine, recently purchased by Samuel Newhouse for \$750,000, Geo. Strickland of Durkee is under arrest and will appear before Judge Smith at 9 o'clock this morning to plead to an indictment for forgery, says the Baker City Democrat. Strickland is a school teacher in the Cracker Creek district.

The deed in question purports to be from William Pristus, who was one of the original locators of the Rainbow property, and conveys all of his right, title and interest in the now famous producer.

Pristus is supposed to have acknowledged the deed in a southern Idaho county, before one E. R. Coulter, a notary, and Coulter and one J. B. Coakney are the witnesses named in the instrument.

The deed was recorded in the county clerk's office just a few days ago, and the unusual character of its purport was at that time remarked.

The deed was then brought before the grand jury and after an investigation that body determined that it was fraudulent and brought a verdict and indictment against young Strickland.

The young man is now in jail under a \$500 bond. Yesterday he had secured no attorney.

Strickland is said to have borne a very good reputation in the community in which he lived and many friends are said to be pained and surprised at the trouble in which he finds himself.

BURIED FOUR DAYS.

Workman Covered, But is Rescued After Four Days.

Mojave, Cal., March 16.—After being buried alive four days, John Marconi, is working today as a miner on the Los Angeles aqueduct. A timber in the tunnel at Pinto, 10 miles north of here, collapsed Monday of last week and Marconi's escape was cut off by a bank of sand 30 feet thick. A two inch pipe was driven through the sand admitting air. Four days and nights employes worked at the sand which ran like water. Friday morning Marconi was rescued.
