RACE THROUGH THIS CITY

TRANSCONTINENTAL AUTO

RACE TO BE SEEN HERE.

Route of Guggenheim Automobile Race From New York to Seattle, is Laid, and Cars Will Pass La Grande.

The route of the great transcontinental automobile race for the M. Robert Guggenheim trophy, between New York and Seattle, has been definitely fixed and the cars will run through La Grande some time in June. Acting on the promises of the state and county road commissioners to have the roads in good condition along the route, the committee has decided to have the race over the Snoqualmie Pass and leaving Mountain Home, Idaho, the cars will pass to the north, crossing the Oregon border at Ontario and continuing through La Grande.

Commissioners of the counties along the route have communicated to the committee their intention to place the roads in good condition, and to that end have promised to go over the road in automobiles that the committee will provide, and wherever it may be necessary to improve conditions such improvements will be made. This route, once established will mean its maintenance as a permanent transcontinental route from ocean to ocean, which means that La Grande will be on this important thoroughfare.

To avoid a conflict with the Glidden tour, the race will be started from New York May 20, 10 days previous to the date originally proposed.

San Francisco interests made a bid for the route to pass through that city, and an offer was made to the management to give another trophy of equal value with the Guggenheim cup and to double the cash prizes if the route would be changed to include San Francisco in the itinerary. The offer, however, was turned down.

Pathfinder cars will be sent over the route to see that sufficient supplies of gasoline are available for the racers. There will be numerous foreign entries for the big race and all of the cars will pass through La Grande.

H. B. 8, Bones—Appropriating \$7,500 for expenses of special session.

H. B. 9, Belknap—To cure defect in act reimbursing George H. Small.
