Plans for New Natatorium.
In the window of Adler's may be seen the perspective of the new natatorium building, for which plans have been drawn by M. P. White, the home architect, for the Mt Springs Land & Improvement company of this city, which contemplates the erection this year of a building to cost between \$15,000 and \$20,000, the cement plunge alone to cost, it is estimated, \$5800. The new natatorium will be built on the site of the present one, at the east end of Center and Church streets.—Baker City Democrat.

THIRD SUDDEN DEATH.
Another Elgin Man Drops Dead Without Warning.
Elgin, March 18.—(Special.)—C. E. MacCellus, living three miles from Elgin, died very suddenly yesterday of heart disease. He arose well, and in usual spirits, but later in the day complained of a pain in the heart. Twenty minutes later he died. This is the third death from heart disease in the past month in the vicinity of Elgin.
