### FREEDOM OF TRUTH

Such is Theme of Stirring Sermon Delivered Last Night.

Ford Ellis, minister of Central Church of Christ, spoke to a large audience last evening on the subject, "Freedom of Truth." Mr. Ellis said in part: "Man is in bondage when his mind is in error. He will not believe an absolute falsehood, but clothe it in truth and man will accept it. The faker is able to sell his wares on the street corner because he is successful in making the bystanders see the little truth in his wares. A system or theory is believed because of the truth that it contains. The Christian Science contains some truth, but it is only a partial truth. He that accepts it, accepts man's conception of truth. It is the truth in the system that wins followers. Feed a horse sawdust and it will not eat it, but mix sufficient amount of sugar and it will eat the entire mixture. There is only one system of life that will free us from bondage, that is the system of Christ. 'If ye abide in my word . . . ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.'"

Next Sunday evening the subject of the sermon will be, "The Faith that Saves."

## DOUBLE LAST RECORD

Twice as many colonists will be brought into the northwest over the O. R. & N. during March and April of this year, as during the same period of time for 1908, if the present rate of traffic continues, says J. H. O'Neill, traveling freight agent. He says the remarkable part of this year's influx of homeseekers is the way in which the heavy traffic continues.

The travel during the time the rates were in effect last year was confined principally to the first few days the rates were in effect. This year it is keeping up, notwithstanding the fact that three weeks have elapsed.

Mr. O'Neill, like others who have been observing the incoming people, is struck with the remarkably prosperous appearance of them. For the most part they seem to be men with means. Men with families who are seeking to better their already good condition and who have the money to enable them to start off in good shape. That they are not the common run of emigrants is also shown by the fact that many of them travel in sleepers instead of riding for days and nights at a time in the day coaches.

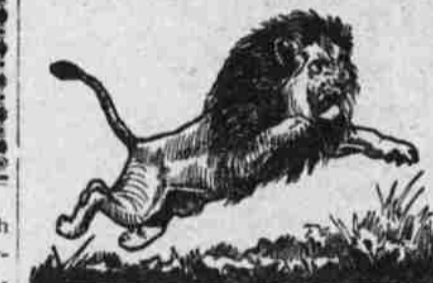
