## LONG HIKE ARTISTS HERE

### HUSBAND AND WIFE EN ROUTE TO PORTLAND, ME.

Mr. and Mrs. Edwards, Who Are Walking From Portland, Oregon, to Portland, Maine, Spent Night Near La Grande—Mrs. Edwards Standing First Test Well.

The Portland, Oregon, to Portland, Maine, pedestrians who left Portland, Oregon, recently, were in La Grande last night and this morning.

Peculiarly enough the two long-distance walkers are not two men, but husband and wife, Edwards by name, who are under contract to walk that distance without aid of any description. By stipulations of the contract they cannot even be interviewed by newspapermen and to avoid the unpleasantness of turning down newspaper representatives, they usually camp just outside of the city limits.

Last night they made camp at Oro Dell, where they enjoyed a pleasant rest, and at noon set out for Baker City. They walk by slow stages, taking the O. R. & N. tracks as a guide, and rest at frequent intervals. Thus far Mrs. Edwards has stood the test well and when more accustomed to "hiking," the distances traveled each day will be increased.

They carry but few supplies, and ship clothing ahead of them by train so that clean apparel is thus provided. Both are under the middle age and are confident of eventually fulfilling their unusual contract.

Few saw them. They are not seeking notoriety and the fewer newspaper stories, published about them, the better they enjoy it.
