The Cove power plant is pulling most of the load carried by the Grande Ronde Electric company at present. Morgan Lake is to be used as an emergency plant in the future. In case of disconnections with either the Cove plant or the Olive Lake power station, in a moment the power from Morgan Lake can be applied, which insures against light and power inconveniences.

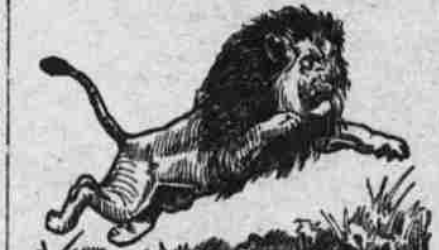
To William Dye, Defendant above named, Greeting:
