Food Commissioner Barnard of Indiana, is rejoicing in the successful passage and enactment of his model sanitation bill for food factories, which he and his associates, as a committee of the Mackinac conference of last summer, drafted for submission in the several states. > sidewalks, ceilings, furniture, receptacles implements and machinery of every establishment or place where food is manufactured, packed, stored, sold or distributed, and all cars, trucks and vehicles used in the transportation of food products, shall at no time be kept in an unclean, unhealthy and unsanitary condition, and for the purof this act, unclean, unhealthful and unsanitary conditions deemed to exist if food in the process necessary, by all reasonable means from all other foreign or injurious contamination and if the refuse, dirt at all good dealers for a free sample. and the waste products subject to decomposition and fermentation incident to the manufacture, preparation, packing, storing, selling, distributing and transporting of food are not removed preclated.
