TRAFFIC UP SNAKE SOON

Baker City, March 24.—As announced in the Herald some time ago, the Northwestern railroad down Snake river will establish passenger service on April 15, from Huntington to Robnette at the mouth of Powder river. Construction trains are now engaged in hauling supplies and material from Huntington to Robnette to facilitate the building of the road beyond the river.

According to the plans of the Utah Construction company, which has the contract for building the road to Homestead, the big tunnel at the Ox Bow will be completed on June 15. This tunnel is a half mile long, measuring a little more than 2600 feet from end to end. A large force of men has been employed for many months in boring the big hole, and the meeting of the two crews at the center of the bore will mark the completion of the great undertaking in building the road. Many piles have been driven for the bridge over Powder river and construction of the bridge will begin before long. If nothing happens to delay the work, trains will be running to Homestead by October 15, 1909. This will be most welcome news to the people of that section, for they will then have rail transportation for their products. As soon as passenger service is established the people of Eagle valley and also Pine valley, can ship their products from Robnette, as roads have been built from the valleys to the mouth of Powder river.
