# MERCHANTS LEAGUE IS "STUNG" NOT LIKELY

**TWO MEN USED CREDIT AND THEN LEFT TOWN.**

Several Local People on List of Victims to Alleged Trickeries—Will Be Brought to La Grande Tonight—Loaded Wagons and Left the City.

D. McCann and C. McIntyre, two men who have been living in La Grande for some months, will be brought back from Huntington by the sheriff tonight on the charge of obtaining goods on false pretenses. It seems that the two worthies, who have families, recently decided that it would be good finance to buy all the goods from La Grande merchants that they could get on time, and then forget to pay. Therefore, during the latter part of last week they visited the Snodgrass grocery, Black & Bramwell's feed store, the Golden Rule, Penington & Co., the Harris Meat market and perhaps other places of business, and bought what they could, promising to pay April 1.

According to the best information at hand they loaded two wagons Sunday night with their ill-begotten wealth, their household goods, etc., and left for parts then unknown. They were located at Huntington, and by request of the La Grande Merchants' association, through the sheriff's office, held there. Sheriff Childers left for Huntington this morning. In addition to the alleged "stinging" of the merchants of the city, these gentlemen borrowed part of a harness from G. W. Coleman and apparently forgot to return it.

In addition to these alleged misdeeds, it is said that the two left about three months' rent unpaid with Mrs. Annie Brooks.
