DECIDE ON FINAL ACTION

The annual convention of the Anti-Saloon League of the state will convene in Portland April 27. Prior to the state convention, probably April 22, the Anti-Saloon organizations of eastern Oregon will hold a convention in Pendleton. The purpose of this latter meeting is to determine the sentiment regarding the presentation to the people in 1910 of a prohibitory amendment to the constitution. It is altogether probable that this action will be taken.

The churches of La Grande will send two delegates each to the Pendleton convention.

Like Forward Pass.

New York, March 25.—The intercollegiate football rules committee meets tonight at the Murray Hill hotel and will also convene tomorrow evening. Only minor changes in the present rules are expected to be made. One of the officials said:

"The forward pass worked well under the regulations imposed under it last fall, and I anticipate no modification of the ruling concerning that feature. There has been complaint against the ruling requiring a gain of 10 yards for every three downs, especially by the stronger teams, which have found it hard to make the distance against an eleven clearly their inferiors. Almost every one admits, however, that the 10-yard rule has given the teams from the smaller colleges a chance against their larger rivals and that is a great point in its favor."

Hunts Junction Disappears.

Hunts Junction is no more, says the Pendleton East Oregonian. On the spot where the historic station formerly stood the sand now blows and there is no one to stop its blowing.

With one fell swoop a Northern Pacific train picked up the Hunts depot yesterday and carried it bodily to Attalia, the building being carried down on two flat cars. At Attalia the depot is now located and it will be refitted for use.

Hunts Junction was abandoned because a station there was no longer needed. Attalia Junction is the point where the Northern Pacific track from Walla Walla joins with the line from this city to Pasco, while Hunts Junction was really no junction at all. In early days it was a junction point for the old Hunt road from Walla Walla to Pendleton. But when the Northern Pacific secured the road Attalia was made the junction and Hunts is now a station of the past.

Pendleton at Indoor Meet.
Pendleton high school will be represented in the big indoor track meet to be held in Portland April 17. At least that is the present plan, though permanent arrangements have not yet been made.—Pendleton Tribune.
