## FREAK IN RAINBOWS

A meteorological phenomenon such as scientists rave over and which according to the best authority at hand has occurred but seldom in the history of the world, was distinctly seen in Grande Ronde valley a few days ago. Data on the phenomenon says that the extent of an inverted rainbow is not unknown, but extremely seldom. In speaking of the local event of so much importance, J. D. Gillilan said this morning: "Recently in company with Rev. A. F. Kline of Summerville, I drove from Alice to Imbler. The day was hazy with occasional sky-showers, light precipitations which did not reach earth. It was a warm afternoon, and a half obscured sun peeped lazily through sluggish, half-transparent, filmy clouds. "Just as we reached the south edge of Imbler, chancing to look upward, I was surprised to see a little to the west of the zenith a very bright section of rainbow; the sun was about two-thirds of the way to the horizon, and this segment was just about half way between the sun and zenith. The position was thus: the convex side of the bow was toward the sun; the points were directed eastward. I may be a non-observing town-clinger, but it was a new thing to my eyes to see a rain bow anywhere but on the side of the beavers opposite the sun. I have seen the bow directly in the north, but that was an mid-winter of course, and exactly at noon; but never before saw it as on that day. Possibly some of your many readers can enlighten an ignoramus and say if such sights often occur."
