LA GRANDE SCALPSELGIN

SURPRISE OF THE DAY IN ELGIN'S ABILITY.

Cold Wind Falls to Dampen Ardor of Local Fans--Herr Has Fine Prospects--Amateurs Will Round into Excellent Shape Soon.

Seven innings of class ball delighted shivering fans at the ball park yesterday when La Grande whalloped Elgin four two. Chattering teeth and blue noses characterized the day but the game was such that such trivial things were forgotten. In fact it was an unusually clever exhibition considering the time of the season and the extreme cold which is always detrimental to fast ball. The surprising feature of the whole affair was the uniformity with which Elgin pulled off good plays and the almost equal gift displayed by every player from the North End. Elgin will be a strong contender for any amateur laurels that may be dangling about at the end of the season awaiting some club to tear it down. The team is well balanced and with one or two exceptions gives signs of being able to manage the willow when time removes present embarrassment. Towner, the popgun and Beyers on the initial sack, were the favorites with La Grande fans. Towner has a peg to bases from the pivotable joint that makes them hug close to shore in time of action.

With La Grande there were several, who, before the season is over, will be fast stuff. Wallace Childers and Zib Zimmerman give a touch of high life and Class D ball, but the lesser lights, who are less use to the glare of spectators and less gifted with intuition, scampered about in a manner that delighted the fans. A sensational hit, catch or double play gave the same a mid-summer color.

Elgin was intent on making things lively for she scored one in the first inning, when a shower of errors, sent Towner home. La Grande balanced up accounts its record, but flunked in the second and third. In the meanwhile Elgin had scored Christensen following his own wallop and single by Balgarth at the proper time. In the third it was one, two, three and ditto henceforth. La Grande shoved Zip over the pan in the fourth by reason of a neat three-base line drive from the tip of M. Childers' stick. In each half from then on La Grande did it one more.

George Herr threw a fine game. Many a whoop-in went up in his honor when doughty Elginites churned the other with no avail. He is cool, and has a fair variety of balls and in many respects handles himself on the stellar mound in a very creditable manner.
