HURRY MOUNTAIN LINES

CHIEF RANGER WILL BUILD SEVERAL MILES

Starkey-Sumpter Telephone Line will be Extensively repaired—Heavy Snow Storm Hurt It.

Harry Powder, chief ranger in this reserve district, came down from North Powder last night where he visited with his family over Sunday, and today started for Starkey, from which point he will begin the repair of the Starkey-Sumpter telephone line at once. The heavy snows of the winter damaged the line to a considerable extent, and quite a lot of work is necessary to put it into commission.

A good many trails, cabins and telephone lines will be built during the coming summer, and Mr. Parker expects to have nearly 20 rangers at work.
