# WHAT UNION AIMS TO DO

PURPOSES ARE MANY AND INVARIABLY WORTHY ONES

Newly-formed Organization in Union County Leads Many Questions Observerward—Organization Held Late Saturday Night.

Innumerable questions have been asked the Observer relative to the purpose of the Co-operative Farmers' Union that is being propagated here. The preamble of the association's constitution is published herewith and throws considerable light on the matter:

"Speculators and those engaged in the distribution of farm products have organized and operate to the great detriment of the farming class.

"To enable farmers to meet these conditions and protect their interests, we have organized the Farmers' Educational and Co-operative Union of America, and declare the following purposes:

- "To establish justice.
- "To secure equity.
- "To apply the Golden Rule.
- "To discourage the credit and mortgage system.
- "To assist our members in buying and selling.
- "To educate the agricultural class in scientific farming.
- "To teach farmers the classification of crops, domestic economy, and the process of marketing.
- "To systematize methods of production and distribution.
- "To eliminate gambling in farm products by Board of Trade, Cotton Exchanges and other speculators.
- "To bring farming up to the standard of other industries and business enterprises.
- "To secure and maintain profitable and uniform prices for grain, cotton, livestock and other products of the farm.
- "To strive for harmony and good will among all mankind and brotherly love among ourselves.
- "To garner the tears of the distressed, the blood of martyrs, the laugh of innocent childhood, the sweat of honest labor and the virtue of a happy home as the brightest jewels known."

Late Saturday afternoon the organization of the first local branch of the Farmers' Educational and Co-operative Union to be formed in this county was completed with officers as follows: J. W. McAllister, president; O. P. Harrison, vice president; W. T. Stein, secretary and treasurer; W. R. Campbell, chairman; Elmer Daron, conductor; N. L. Ackl, door-keeper. The other members are P. Zurbrick, C. D. Huffman, E. S. Norris, I. E. Chenault, J. A. Holman, G. M. Curtis, Walter Ferguson and A. F. Stein.

Another meeting is planned for next Saturday, and on Wednesday Mr. Cox, the organizer, will attend the Grange meeting at Grange hall, where he will address the farmers. It is hoped by Mr. Cox and those who have become interested in the movement that at least five locals may soon obtain charters in this county so that a county organization may be effected. Fifteen members are necessary to form a local. Already there is talk at North Powder, Union and Cove, and it is entirely probable that the first of May will see Union county producers united.
