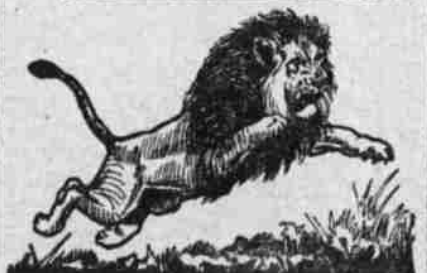

**CONCERT A MARVEL**

Viewed from any standpoint, but one, the La Grande band concert last evening was a startling success. The crowd was small—far too small to be a credit to the city. But such music! The opening overture captured the audience and from then on there was continuous flow of harmony that delighted the hearers. In concert, in solo, or in groups, no matter how the arrangement of instruments, the results were invariably the same. Selections were difficult, more so than customary in a concert of this kind, but no matter how intricate the time, how close the harmony, Conductor Selak always brushed perfection from the galaxy of players. In his own style of baton manipulation the leader brings out soft strains and the crash of instruments at the moments the author intended for them. If there were any two numbers that were superior to the others, it was the Adkin clarinet solo and the sextette. From out of the band, Miss Young thrilled the audience with a violin solo, and Miss Foley was heard at her best when she sang a selection from "Mattiata." Those who were there know the event to be the peer of all concerts given here and those who did not enjoy the treat incidentally failing to support one of the best bands in the state, can only rue it.
