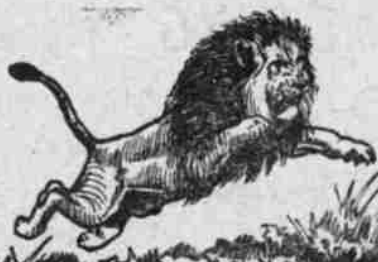

OLD RELIC
IN DEMAND

A message came humming over the wires late last night from Roosevelt to Publicity Manager Fred R. Currey, asking for the elephant gun now hanging in the Observer office, and which Mr. Currey has obtained from a direct descendant of Sir Samuel Baker, the great African explorer, who according to the story of the man from whom the gun was last purchased, used it on the Nile to shoot hippopotami. The gun is a very large one, something like six feet over all, or from butt plate to muzzle, whichever way it is proper to describe the dimensions of a gun, and has a capacity of a quarter pound of powder and a proportionate quantity of lead, or boulders, as more convenient. It seems that upon the arrival of our ex-president at Messina yesterday, among the stories related to him were several regarding the prowess of the noted Baker, and his curiosity was aroused regarding the weapon that would kill these animals at such incredible distances. His inquiries soon led him to interview an old African hunter to whom the descendant of Baker had confided the story of the sale of the gun, and the message, which we print below, was immediately filed for transmission. It did not reach this city until 2 o'clock this morning.
