STRANGE MARRIAGE LAW

LEGAL TO MARRY WIFE'S SISTER'S DAUGHTER NOW

Portions of Eastern Country Will Not Permit Such Action However—Clergyman in Deep Quandary.

SYDNEY, N. Z., April 9.—A curious anomaly has recently been brought to light in connection with the legislation permitting marriage with a deceased wife's sister. A Sydney clergyman was asked to marry a man to his deceased wife's sister's daughter. Under the ecclesiastical law the ceremony could not take place, but since marriage with the intended bride's mother would have been allowable under the civil law, surely there could be no objection to the marriage of the daughter? The point has not been raised before in New South Wales and the clergyman was in a quandary. He sought the advice of the Viceroy-General, who was of the opinion that the marriage would be illegal. The registrar gave a similar judgment. Had the parties gone to South Australia, however, they could have been legally married, and what is equally remarkable the ceremony would have been recognized as binding in New South Wales. South Australia was apparently the only portion of the Empire which, when it made marriage with a deceased wife's sister legal, also extended the right to the sister's daughter.

CONVICTS WITH COUNTY.

Georgia Making Use of Its Convict Labor Provisions.

ATLANTA, Ga., April 10.—The different counties in the state are busily providing work for the 1200 convicts that the state has transferred from private stockades to the counties in which they were condemned.
With about 3000 misdemeanors convicts throughout the state in jails and on county farms these men of stripes will be put to work on the public roads. The end of the lease system and the transfer of the felony convicts from private stockades means employment for about 1500 free laborers in the lumber mills, fertilizer plants and brick plants that have employed convict labor.
