SYDNEY, N. Z., April 9 .- A curious anomaly has recently been brought to light in connection with the legislation permitting marriage with a deseased wife's sister. Under the ecclesiastical law the ceremony could not take place, but since marriage with the intended bride's mother would have been allowable under the civil law, surely there could be no objection to the marriage of the daughter?
