LINCOLN ATE DOG

Mrs. Ellen Cross a member of the Lincoln Memorial Committee, gives an interesting interview that brings out a new story on Lincoln. To the Observer today she said:

"A pleasing incident was related to me by a lady formerly from Springfield Illinois, but now located here and I feel sure she will pardon me for giving this to the press. Her uncle of Springfield, was a very intimate and close friend of Lincoln, often helping him split rails. So one time they struck out to find work, going to Missouri, about where Kansas City now stands. They halted for rest, the uncle remarking to Lincoln that he was almost starved; so hungry he could eat a dog. Lincoln, looking up, said: There goes one now and a yellow one too. The uncle picked up a rock and remarkably enough the aim was true. The dog fell dead. They dressed it, built a fire and on hot rocks fried the meat. Both remarking the meal tasted fine."
